


# Santa Clara University (Peer Group #2)

## Performance: Pell Share


Santa Clara and its Peers, 2022-23






Between 2015-16 and 2022-23, Santa Clara added 78 Pell students.

Santa Clara and ATI Privates, 2022-23




13 percent of Santa Clara students are from the bottom four income categories, compared to 19 percent at institutions in Santa Clara's sector.

Santa Clara and its Peers



In the most recent year, Santa Clara's six-year Pell graduation rate was higher than its overall six-year grad rate and higher than its peers' average six-year Pell grad rate. Santa Clara's Pell retention rate was higher than its overall retention rate but lower than its peers' average Pell retention rate.



## First-Generation Student Enrollment

Santa Clara and its Peers, 2022-23



In 2022-23, 13 percent of Santa Clara students were first-generation, and 5 percent were first-generation and received Pell.<sup>1</sup>
